

# 2. The Almshouses College Street

The Almshouses are a set of 6 single bed properties on College Street. They exist due to the generosity of George Newman, who died in 1855 having spent 14 of his years as a resident of Higham Ferrers.



The foundation stone for the Almshouses was laid in 1866 after George's will, proved in the Prerogative Court of Canterbury in 1855, gave "such part of his personal estate as he could lawfully bequeath for charitable purposes to support six poor Almswomen". In a time before state-funded benefits such bequeathments were a significant and welcome support for those were unable to provide for themselves. The original wording allowed for each resident to receive "8 shillings a week, for ever". Today, each resident of the Almshouses still receives a small annual grant at Christmas-time.

Little is known of why George Newman chose to make his gift that allowed the Almshouses to be built, but today his legacy still stands and the Almshouses still provide for 6 residents of the town - though the rules were changed some time ago to allow men to live there too.

George Newman is buried in Higham Ferrers at St Mary's Church, the proximity of his grave to the church seemingly indicating his level of importance to the town.

Newman's Charity, and the administration and management of the Almshouses, was with Wilson Browne Solicitors for a number of years, but now sits with Higham Ferrers Town Council.

# Higham Ferrers United Charities

What do you know about Higham Ferrers United Charities? Read on to find out a little about this historic Trust...


Higham Ferrers has a rich history dating back hundreds of years, and over those years some significant residents of the town set up charitable funds or bequeathed money in their will to be used in certain ways. These funds would have originally been administrated individually but over time and as the provisions in the town changed it made sense to bring them together under one umbrella. Thus, in 1914 Higham Ferrers United Charities was formed.

Today the Trust is overseen by a board of 12 Trustees made up of long-standing members of the community, including representatives from both main churches in the town. The main responsibilities of the Trust are to manage the Almshouses on College Street, and appoint and oversee the Bedesmen and Pressland Pensioners. You can read a little about the history of the Almshouses on the page opposite.

The Bedesmen are a proud tradition dating back 600 years to the time of Henry Chichele. Originally, they all lived together at the Bede House with a Bedeswoman to look after them. They earned one penny a day (a very good living in those days). The word 'Bede' means prayer, and the Bedesmen lived their life to a definite rule divided in monastic style into periods of prayer and manual work in the gardens. Today, we still have 12 Bedesmen and one Bedeswoman and although their roles are now largely ceremonial (and they no longer live together at the Bede House!) they are still an important part of Higham Ferrers' civic traditions. You can still see them at events such as Remembrance Day or the Civic Service in their traditional blue woollen cloaks with red stars.

The Pressland Pensioners were formed as a result of the will of Selina Dennis Pressland, who lived in Higham Ferrers her whole life and died in the late 1880's. Selina left a sum of money for 'the benefit of poor widows belonging to the Town'. Today, we still appoint Pressland Pensioners when there is a vacancy and welcome applications from all women of pensionable age who live in Higham Ferrers.

Under the original aims of the Trust, the Almspeople, Bedesmen and Pressland Pensioners all receive a small stipend every Christmas time from the charity and also get invited to events like the Christmas and Summer Parties. The general day-to-day work of Higham Ferrers United Charities is undertaken by Higham Ferrers Town Council at the Town Hall.

#### **Update on our Charitable Giving!**

But she was in for a surprise when she returned to Chichele College where the horticultural show was being held, to discover she had taken first prize in the chocolate celebration cake category – and scooped the coveted silver salver for being the Best Baker.

Her prize-winning creation included several elements, including dark chocolate, white chocolate in a feathered effect and chocolate chards. Never having made a pie before, she was also thrilled to take second place for her plum and marzipan pie.

# In Memoriam

The Town Council was saddened to learn of the deaths of two Past Mayors and Councillors in the recent weeks.

In July Margaret Tuffnail passed away.

Margaret, affectionately known as 'Tuffy',
was a member of the Town Council for 24
years from May 1987-1995 and again from
1999-2015. She was Mayor of Higham
Ferrers in 1991-1992. Margaret was a well
known and friendly face around the town and
a respected councillor with a wealth of
experience. She will be greatly missed and
always remembered.





In August we lost Derek Lawson MBE.

Derek was the longest serving member of the Town Council with an incredible 57 years of service. He was Mayor of Higham Ferrers on three occasions and Leader of the Council for five. Derek had a long list of achievements, including Chairman of both East Northants District Council and Northamptonshire County Council, Chairman of the Board of Governors for the Ferrers School and Henry Chichele Primary School, and involvement in several

campaigns to improve the roads and services in the area.

For his years of commitment to local government Derek was awarded with an MBE in 2017, and later the Honorary Freedom of Higham Ferrers in 2022.

Derek's impact on the Town Council and the local government landscape cannot be understated. He dedicated his life to serving the people of Higham Ferrers and the surrounding area and his knowledge and insight will be sorely missed.



#### What is the Neighbourhood Plan?

The Neighbourhood Plan is a document that contains a vision of how the town will be by 2031, setting out objectives and local planning policies. The policies are used to help North Northamptonshire Council decide whether to approve planning applications for new buildings or changes to existing buildings or infrastructure. Back in 2011 the council first agreed work towards the Plan with a Steering Group subsequently set up to deliver it. The Steering Group members comprised representatives from the Town Council and the community. The Plan was completed in April 2016. Neighbourhood Plans benefit from regular monitoring and review with revision from time to time to reflect changing





# **GOOD NEWS for the Development of a Community Library and Wellbeing Hub**

In the last edition we reported of our hope to receive funding to develop and provide library and wellbeing services within the town. The good news is that funding to the sum of £22,310 has been awarded to the council from North Northamptonshire Council. Part of this funding will be used to buy library furniture, equipment and stock and part to employ a 'Community Connector' to develop the wellbeing services and to assist the council with the overall set up of the hub. The hub will be based out of the community room at the back of the former library building now owned by Snowdon Homes.

The Community Library and Wellbeing Hub will also have volunteering opportunities available to enable it to open regularly, ideally every day. Thank you to those that have already offered to volunteer. If you haven't already and wish to, please contact us.


